Message from the Executive Director

This was a year of impact and opportunity for Whole Child Indian River. With a 79% increase in website visits and a 48% increase in monthly intensive users, we reached more families than ever before.

One of the year's highlights was the opportunity to partner with Indian River Academy. A Title I school with 88% of students on free or reduced lunch, the needs of families are many. Throughout the year, we participated in many meaningful activities with

students, parents, and teachers, and transformed a dismal space into an inviting courtyard and mural. Thanks to the generosity of Quail Valley Charities, we were able to establish the first ever Whole Child Connection Corner.

It was at the Connection Corner that we met the mother of two young daughters – a six month old and eight year old - who had not been to a doctor due to lack of health insurance. When she was shown the Whole Child profile, you could practically see the weight lift from her shoulders and the relief fill her eyes. Through Whole Child's website, she found information on physicians and resources to apply for health insurance. It was a poignant reminder of why this program is needed in our community.

The continued growth of Whole Child would not possible without the support and involvement of our community. On behalf of Whole Child and the Junior League, I thank each one of you - our providers, volunteers, businesses, schools, sponsors, and donors – for working together to make sure children thrive.

Responding to Community Needs

This year, Whole Child was proud to partner with Indian River Academy to support their vision of creating a safe environment where all students engage in their own self-efficacy so that they learn the lifelong skills needed to be successful emotionally, socially, and academically.

Our primary goal was to help families connect to resources that meet all the needs of their children. We assisted faculty in creating activities that built parent-school relationships, celebrated their children's accomplishments, and nurtured the culture of safety. Parents

lacking a computer or in need of a quiet, private setting were able to complete a profile at the Whole Child Connection corner, located in the school's media center.

One of the most visible evidences of our impact was a project called **Beautiful Spaces**. Research indicates that changing the landscape of a child's environment has a positive



effect on attitudes and behaviors. The Beautiful Spaces project was an opportunity to bring together a school, non-profit agency, local businesses, volunteers, students, and parents to transform a courtyard at Indian River Academy. Students contributed to the mural by adding handprint flowers, allowing them to take ownership in the creation of a beautiful space at their school and instilling a sense of responsibility to encourage fellow students to keep it that way.

Measures of Growth


Site Impressions indicate a user has obtained information about a provider. The number of site impressions in the 2013-2014 fiscal year increased by 79% over last year.

Intensive users spend a minimum of 30 minutes on our website and obtain information on three or more providers. Intensive users represent unique families, so the actual number of people served each month is two to three times the number of intensive users. The number of intensive users in the 2013 -2014 fiscal year increased by 48% over last year.
